Scholarships

Supporting Academic & Career Choices

The Foundation partnered with our community to make a tremendous difference in the class of 2020! This year saw 22 scholarships, ranging from \$500 - \$20,000 awarded to wonderful high school seniors. Scholarships from our community, brokered through the Foundation totaled \$57,500 this year, in addition to \$3000 in scholarships directly from the Foundation. These recognize student achievement, support a technical career or college degree, and encourage middle school students to complete high school with a goal in mind.

Classroom Grants

Enrichment for All Students

Our grant program allows teachers to develop exciting enrichment opportunities for their classrooms and even grade levels to be funded with the Foundation's support. 2019 - 2020 was our biggest year and our biggest challenge! In total, over 33 grants were awarded totaling over \$30,000 of extra support to our schools. The COVID19 pandemic changed everyone's plans, and about half of the grants are rolled over into this school year.

Although too numerous to detail each one, here is a summary of what the grant program funded in 2019 - 2020

Field Trips: MOHAI, Holocaust Museum, Pacific Science Center, Woodland Park Zoo, Camp Moran (Moran State Park), Museum of Flight, Maxwelton Outdoor Classroom, 1st Grade Frog Prince Trip to Storybook Teller Theater

Enrichment: Funds to establish STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) Club, Lego Robotics Club, Iditarod Subscription, Math Manipulatives, Classroom Book Sets, NWLA China Week, Dog Days of Summer Book Program, Northwest Language Art (NWLA) global cultures experience, Traveling Lantern Theatre's production of The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe, Learning A-Z website subscription

Supplies: CD Player, mBots for coding class, anchor charts for learning strategies, and a coffee machine for life skills class to start a business!

Emotional Support, Confidence, and Resilience: Trauma certification, Suicide Prevention & Mental Health training

Get Active & Healthy: Supplies to build birdhouses, supplies to build outdoor shade for the garden, Octoball Pit, Flex Space seating, stationary bike and a bike peddler. We also sponsor a Harvest of the Month in association with the popular Connected Foods Program



Circumnavigate Whidbey, Socially Distant

Circumnavigate Whidbey Island is our largest annual fundraiser. With COVID, the typical format of families cheering, community members forging the route, and celebrations afterwards had to be radically changed! This year, board member James Steller, joined by 8 wonderful parents of Coupeville Schools circumnavigated the

island's distance by foot, bike, swimming, and paddle boarding - but they all started at different spots on the island! The event raised over \$25,000 for our schools. Here is hoping next year, we can get the community out there and active again.

Financial Recap 2019-2020 School Year

The Foundation received \$97,445 in donations. We distributed \$73,071 for classroom grants and educational programs, college scholarships, and the Promise Fund. Expenses continued to be low at \$2,186. The remaining balance is restricted to future year grants and multi-year scholarships.

The pie chart provides an overview of how your giving is allocated to the schools. It also demonstrates our fiscal commitment to you to make every dollar count by keeping expenses low. Please note that many of the grants awarded this year were suspended due to COVID and will move to 2020 - 2021 year, if applicable.
