To start the year, iReady begins with a diagnostic test. This was super helpful to me! Not seeing kids' work on a daily basis was difficult. The diagnostic result helped me identify struggling students.

Other benefits included being able to assign grade level assignments to go with my lesson as well as iReady individualizing assignments to reinforce weak student skills. I require students to successfully complete one of those lessons a week. This means I may have one student working on a second grade skill that week while a different student is working on a fifth grade skill. I could never individualize the entire class before, so this has been very helpful. And for the most part, students are able to independently do this work and feel successful.

Classroom Grants ~ Enrichment for All Students

The October of 2019 grant cycle turned out to be the last normal thing we did! The 2020 - 2021 school year started and stayed virtual - and we worked with the school district administrators to re-appropriate the funds usually used for teacher grants into the most important and effective support we could. In all, \$45,000 was donated in September of 2020 for COVID Relief. This grant was targeted to increase success with remote learning, supporting the Coupeville School District as it incorporated new software (iReady and Character Strong) and new technology hardware (lapel mics, cameras, and hot spots) to support teachers.

We were really pleased that the contributions supported the three areas the Foundation values: Equity in access to education, scholastics, and mental wellness.

Equity: For teachers - wireless headsets, speakers, and GoPro cameras were purchased to help set up virtual classrooms. For students, wireless hot spots and associated subscriptions were funded to ensure all students could access their classes

Enrichment: i-Ready is a comprehensive assessment and instruction program that empowers educators with the resources they need to help all students succeed. See teacher Toni Crebbin's explanation in side bar.


Social & Emotional Support: Character Strong is an extensive curriculum to support Social Emotional Learning K - 12. Lessons are arranged around 10 character traits: Respect, Courage, Perseverance, Honesty, Kindness, Empathy, Gratitude, Creativity, Responsibility, and Cooperation. The school counselors were able to use this software to connect with students and focus on student mental well-being and their families.

Scholarships ~ *Supporting Academic & Career Choices*

Our community partnered with the Foundation to make a tremendous difference in the class of 2021! This year saw 21 scholarships ranging from \$500 - \$10,000 awarded to 12 high school seniors. Scholarships from our community, brokered through the Foundation totaled \$31,500 this year, in addition to \$3000 in scholarships directly awarded by the Foundation. This year, one of the foundation scholarships honored Rick Widdison, who retired from our Board after 24 years of service!

These recognize student achievement, support a technical career or college degree, and encourage middle school students to complete high school with a goal in mind.


Financial Recap

2020-21 School Year

The Foundation received \$121,342 in donations. We distributed \$56,133 to grants, promise fund, scholarships or donor directed funds. Expenses remained low at \$1686. The remaining balance is restricted to future year grants and multi-year scholarships.
